Kanopy is Now Available for Streaming

Ramsey County Library is excited to announce that the popular on-demand film streaming service Kanopy is now available! Library card holders can access over 30,000 films, documentaries and TV series.

Visit relreads.org and sign in with your library card. Kanopy will ask you to create an account that you can use to log in from any computer, television, mobile device or platform by downloading the Kanopy app for iOS, Android, AppleTV, Chromecast or Roku.

There is a limit of 10 checkouts per calendar month and three days to watch each film. Once you press play, you have three days to view a film as many times as you like without using another play credit. Play credits reset on the first of the month.

Meet Alex Regal: A MNsure-Certified Navigator

Alex Regala is a MNsure-certified navigator who works for Health Access MN, a health advocacy organization founded in 2013 to help people enroll in health coverage through on-line exchanges, like MNsure, created by the Affordable Care Act. He has been coming to the libraries in Maplewood and Roseville for the past three years.

"I've always been passionate about social services. Working as a health navigator I am able to answer questions and help with the MNsure application at no cost. I enjoy helping people understand their health coverage options." Regala says, "For instance, people don't always realize they may still be able to get health insurance even after open enrollment has ended. This is especially true for people who have lost their job or make less money because of the coronavirus. It really depends on their situation."

In 2019, 294 individuals/families at Maplewood and 369 individuals/families at Roseville were given in depth help with enrollment in health insurance.

While Health Access MN has suspended its onsite assistance at the libraries due to COVID-19, navigators like Regala are available and ready to help by phone. - An individual over the age of 60.
- An individual who is self-quarantining due to COVID-19.
- Or an individual with a health, transportation, or disability barrier that precludes them from using curbside pickup service.

The struggle for dignity and full citizenship for African-Americans didn't end at Appomattox or even with the passage of the landmark Civil Rights legislation of the 1960s. Some would contend that, for many, the Civil War continues to this day.
