- **Sidewalk chalk - *to help you share your poetry with the world***

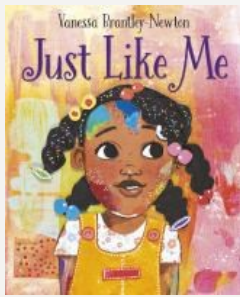
