


















Directions for Ladybug (Video time 1:00)






1	On the Bees and Ladybugs page cut out one of each of the following: Body, Head, Spots and Eyes. The additional copies are extra in case you need them.		
2	Take your sheet of red paper and trace around the body circle. Repeat this 6 times.		
3	With your scissors, carefully cut out the circles you have traced on the red page.		
4	Take each of your 6 circles and fold each in half.		
5	Using your glue stick, put glue on half of the outside of a circle.		
6	Glue this half circle to another of your red circles.		




7	Repeat 5 times until you have all 6 circles glued so they look like a book. This is your ladybug's body.	
8	Take your sheet of white paper (regular paper, not the half sheet of thicker cardstock) and using the circle labeled spots, trace 5-10 times. Now using your makers / crayons / colored pencils, color in your spots. You can pick whatever colors you would like.	
9	Cut out your spots.	
10	Glue your spots into your ladybug body.	
11	Using your white sheet of paper again, trace the head template and trace the eye template twice.	



<p>12</p>	<p>You can color or decorate your head and eyes and then cut them out.</p>	
<p>13</p>	<p>Take one of the pieces of white cardstock (the thicker half sheet of paper) and fold it in half.</p>	
<p>14</p>	<p>Close your ladybug's body so it looks like a half circle. Line the outside of the body up with the fold of the card and glue half of the body to the card making sure that the center fold on the body lines up with the fold of the card. One half of the Ladybug body is now attached to the card.</p>	



15	<p>Think about where you want your ladybug's head to be. Place the head and eyes where you think you would like them, does it look how you would like. If you would like you can mark where you want the eyes to go, and then place them off to the side. When you are satisfied glue the head under the unglued half of the body.</p>	
16	<p>Fold the ladybug body in half and apply glue to the outside. Once glued carefully close the card, gluing the one half to the card. When you reopen the card the ladybug body will be attached to the card.</p>	
17	<p>Glue eyes to head.</p>	
18	<p>Decorate the rest of the card as you want.</p>	
19	<p>Your ladybug card is complete.</p>	

Directions for Bee (Video time 15:30)





1	Take the template page (Bees and Ladybugs) and cut out the pieces. You only need one of each sized circle but there is an extra one just in case. Cut out one of each, body, head, spots, eyes and wings.	
2	Take your sheet of yellow paper and trace around the body circle. Repeat this 4 times.	
3	Carefully cut out the circles you have traced on the yellow paper with scissors.	
4	Take your sheet of white paper (regular paper, not the half sheet of thicker cardstock) and trace around the body circle. Repeat this 4 times.	
5	Now using your markers / crayons / colored pencils, color in your white body circles. You can pick whatever colors you would like.	
6	Carefully cut out the circles you have traced on the white paper with scissors.	
7	You now have 4 yellow circles and 4 circles you colored. Take each of your 8 circles and fold them in half. Fold the circles you colored with the white on the outside, and the color on the inside.	





<p>8</p>	<p>Using your glue stick, put glue on one half of the outside of a folded circle. Glue the circle to a half of the other color. Repeat gluing alternating colors as you glue until all 8 pieces are glued together.</p>	
<p>9</p>	<p>Using your white sheet of paper (regular paper, not the half sheet of thicker cardstock) again, trace the head template once and trace the eye and wing template twice.</p>	
<p>10</p>	<p>You can color or decorate your head, wings and eyes. Then cut them out.</p>	






<p>11</p>	<p>Take one of the pieces of white cardstock (the thicker half sheet of paper) and fold it in half.</p>	
<p>12</p>	<p>Place your bee wings, body, and head on the card. Rearrange until you are happy with the results. If you would like you can mark where you want the wings and head to go, and then place them off to the side. Place glue on the lower part of the wings and glue them down. Close your bee's body so it looks like a half circle. Line the outside of the body up with the fold of the card and glue half of the body to the card making sure that the center fold on the body lines up with the fold of the card. One half of the Bee body is now attached to the card.</p>	

13	Glue the head under the unglued half of the body. Then glue the body over part of the head. Fold the Bee body in half. Apply glue to the outside of the Bee body. Once glued carefully close the card, gluing the one half to the card. When you reopen the card the Bee body will be attached to the card.	
14	Glue the eyes to head.	
15	Decorate the rest of the card as you want.	
16	Your bee card is complete.	

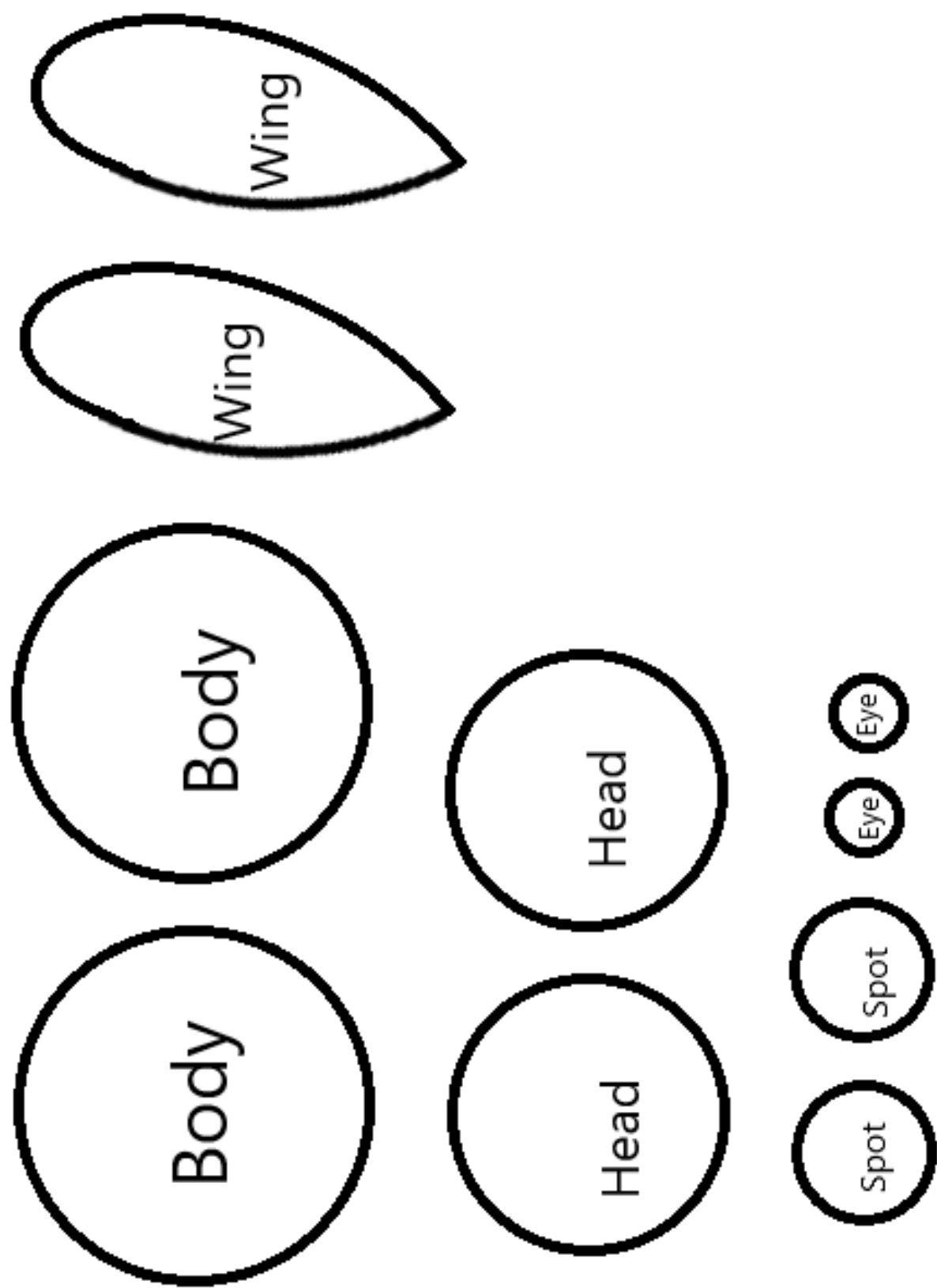
Second Type of Popup Card (Video time 29:10)

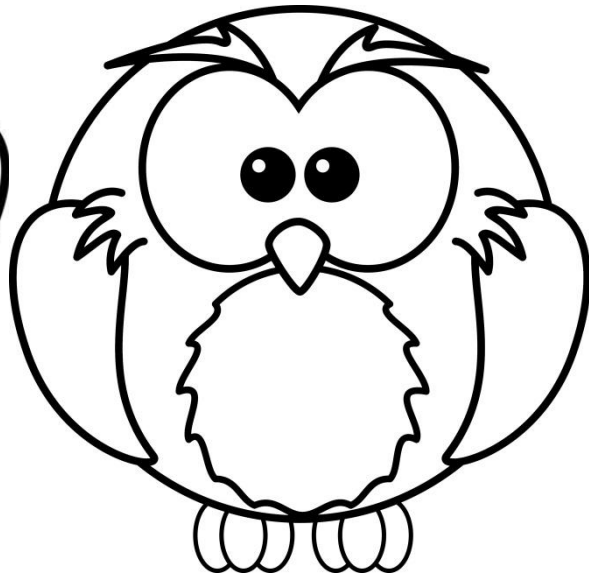
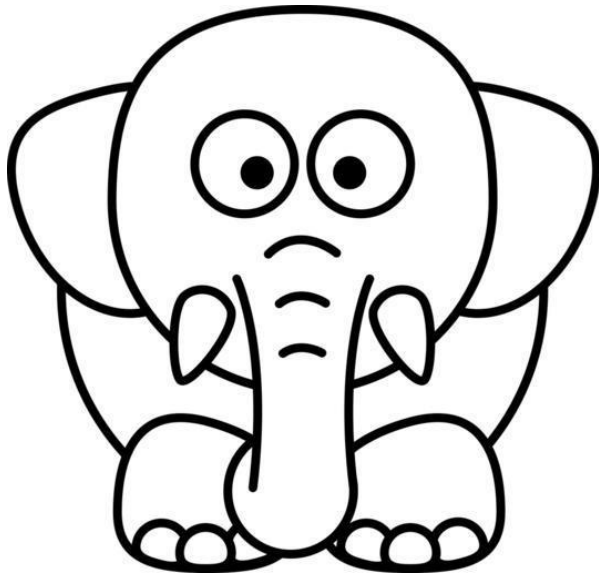
1	Find the template page with the elephant, owl and the cupcake.	
2	Color the picture you choose, the elephant, owl or the cupcake, however you would like and then cut it out.	
3	Cut out the rectangle along the bold solid lines. Do not cut along dotted lines.	
4	Lay your shape down with the white side up. Lay the rectangle from step 3 down on top of your shape with the box farthest from the half box labeled glue, covering the bottom of your shape. Trace 3 sides of the box onto the back of the shape.	

5	Fold the rectangle piece at the 4 dotted lines. It should now be in the shape of a square.	
6	Apply glue to the small rectangle that says glue and glue the square closed.	
7	Take one of the pieces of white cardstock (the thicker half sheet of paper) and fold it in half.	
8	Apply glue to one side of the square and place it along the fold line of your card. Carefully close the card gluing one side of the square to the card.	
9	Open the card back up. Apply glue to the side of the square to connect it to the card. Carefully close the card gluing a second side of the square to the card	

10	Place the picture you choose on the square and see if you like how it looks. Make sure you can close the card and the shape does not stick out.	<p>It should be like this</p>  <p>Not Like This</p> 
11	Apply glue to the inside of the square you traced on the back of your shape you choose and line up the picture on the square then press onto the square.	  
12	Decorate the rest of the card as you want.	
13	Your card is now complete
