September 21: The Violence Project: How to Stop a Mass Shooting Epidemic

By some measures, gun violence has almost doubled in our cities over the past year. Join James Densley as he looks at violence prevention and innovative ways to stop the social contagion of mass shootings in the United States. Densley is Professor and Department Chair of Criminal Justice at Metropolitan State University and the author of six books, most recently, "The Violence Project: How to Stop a Mass Shooting Epidemic."

September 28: Free Speech: A Contested Symbol of Democracy

Free speech is a fundamental symbol of our democracy, but its meaning is "essentially contested," says Ronald W. Greene, because that meaning changes each time it's challenged or expanded. Join Dr. Greene, a professor in the Department of Communication Studies at the University of Minnesota, as he charts the interactions between free speech and democracy as they have defined political strife in the United States over the last 50 years and more.

October 5: St. Paul and Kidnapping in America

From the toxic brew of Prohibition and the Great Depression emerged a new threat: kidnapping for ransom. Starting in the Midwest, the "snatch racket" spread rapidly, reportedly reaching 3,000 kidnappings in 1931 alone. Join author Carolyn Cox as she explores how Saint Paul vied with St. Louis and Chicago for the dishonor of being America's "kidnap capital." Cox is a retired attorney and law professor, and the author of "The Snatch Racket: The Kidnapping Epidemic That Terrorized 1930s America." *This program is funded with money from Minnesota's Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund*. There was a time when national TV newscasters possessed some of the most universally trusted voices in America. That era has clearly ended, but how did we get from Walter Cronkite to today's indiscriminate charges of "fake news"? Matt Carlson, an associate professor at the Hubbard School of Journalism and Mass Communication at the University of Minnesota, will explore news trends over time, moving from an era when a few mainstream organizations controlled most of what we know, to our modern explosion of digital voices.

October 19: The Problem of Monopolies and the Poor

Why are decent housing, adequate medical care, and other basic life necessities so often out of reach for low and middleincome families? James A. Schmitz, Jr., a senior research economist at the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis, suggests that part of the problem are modern monopolies that block low-cost goods and services from reaching those who need them most. Join Dr. Schmitz for a provocative look at the past and present role of the monopoly. *Presented in partnership with the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute of the University of Minnesota*.

October 26: How the Streets Were Made

The idea of "the streets" has long influenced our understanding of Black culture. Join Dr. Yelena Bailey, Director of Education Policy at the State of Minnesota's Professional Educator Licensing and Standards Board, as she discusses the historical legacy of geographically segregated Black spaces, as well as the role they have played in shaping our contemporary perceptions of Black identity through music, film and literature. Bailey is the author of "How the Streets Were Made: Housing Segregation and Black Life in America."
