

Ramsey County Library Plans for Renovation at Maplewood Location



Planning for an interior renovation of the public spaces at the library in Maplewood is underway. The interior renovation project will provide a refreshed facility with a new layout and will best support the community of Maplewood for many years to come.

Built in 2007, the finishes as well as the furniture in the library all have since been outdated. Changes to the interior of the building are based on community engagement and feedback that began in 2018. The design phase of the project was drafted with feedback from the community in March 2022. Planned features include improved acoustics, increase the number of study and meeting spaces, improve lighting and provide more comfortable seating.

Project design will continue through the first quarter 2023 with construction starting later in the year. Check rclreads.org for upcoming community engagement events or subscribe to the Library's e-newsletter at bit.ly/RCL_e-newsletters.

Ramsey County Library Data Stories Highlight 2021 Milestones

In 2021, Ramsey County Library circulated 2.4 million materials and was a Star Library for a eighth consecutive year - one of five in Minnesota for 2021! The Library also provided both in-person and a variety of pre-recorded and follow-along virtual programming, from Zoom storytimes to online tech help for adults, teens and kids. There was a total of 1,162 programs (in-person and virtual) attended by 26,745 participants.

Daybreak Woman

Thursday, July 14, 7 p.m. Zoom Webinar

Daybreak Woman, also known as Jane Anderson Robertson, was born at a trading post on the Minnesota River in 1810 and lived for ninety-two years in Minnesota, Wisconsin, Michigan, Canada and South Dakota. Join Jane Lamm Carroll as she explores the life of the daughter of an Anglo-Canadian trader and a Scots-Dakota woman, a woman who witnessed seismic changes in Minnesota society over the course of the 19th century.

Carroll is the professor of history and women's studies at St. Catherine University, and is the author of "Daybreak Woman: An Anglo-Dakota Life."

A Natural Curiosity: The Story of the Bell Museum
